Ideas by Meeting Location

The foundation of *big. small. all. champaign county* is formed by the ideas generated at the Countywide Community Dialogues. In November 2005, those who live and work in Champaign County were invited to attend two-hour, open, public brainstorming meetings to think about the future. A total of 681 people worked in small groups with a trained facilitator to respond to the following question: “What can we do to make Champaign County the best that it can be in the coming years?”

This report includes all of the 2,222 ideas generated at the Dialogues. They are organized by meeting location. In total, there were ten Dialogues – one youth kickoff and nine public meetings. A list of the meeting dates, locations, and attendance is included on the following page. In addition, ideas submitted via telephone, surface mail, email, and the website as well as those generated during the facilitator training sessions are included in this report. The list of ideas includes a unique identification number for each idea, the number of the group in which the idea was generated, the verbatim text of the idea, and the ranking. (See sidebar for description of the ranking.)

Once all of the ideas from the meetings were entered verbatim into a computerized database, they were reviewed, appropriate categories that summarized the emerging themes were developed, and the ideas were sorted into these categories. Ranking of Ideas

The small groups ranked their top five ideas solely for the purposes of reporting a summary of their discussion to the larger group during the plenary session at the end of the Dialogue.

These rankings provide an indicator of the types of ideas that are important to residents of Champaign County, but all of the ideas generated during the brainstorming process, regardless of rank, will be used as the visioning process continues.

As the visioning process continues, the ideas generated by the public will be used to develop goals for the future of Champaign County and to identify the strategies that can turn those goals into reality.
